



Training for Practitioners in International Arbitration 2022

We announce a set of four training sessions focused on practitioners on international arbitration which will be delivered in 2022 by a faculty of leading experts in the field, in collaboration with four arbitral centres across the African continent.

The training sessions will involve practical exercises based on a case study, designed to enhance the skills and capacity of participants to address issues that arise in complex international arbitral proceedings. It will cover strategy and ethics, drafting, advocacy and hearing preparations, and the workings of the arbitral tribunal.

Participants will be required to undertake some independent study and work ahead of the training, and to attend all training sessions.

Learning outcomes: to enhance each participant's understanding of the role of an efficient counsel in international arbitration; practice modern drafting and advocacy skills; and gain insight into and understanding of the functioning of the arbitral tribunal.

Who should attend: practising lawyers and state counsel who wish to enhance their skills as counsel or party representative in international arbitration.
